

**Are the Millstream CCP Courses different as far as being able to see your student’s grades?**

Due to the way CCP is built into Millstream courses, the grades are currently available for view. It is Millstream’s discretion as to whether this will remain the case.

**What year do you recommend taking the Millstream Career Evaluation?**

The Millstream Career Evaluation can be taken any time during high school. Sophomore year is a good time if your student is considering applying for a Millstream Program but otherwise, any time that your student is questioning their strengths/weaknesses or what career choice they want to pursue would be a valid time.

**Why are all of the meetings on Thursday nights?**

While no evening is free of community events, Thursday seems to be an evening that is free of *some* of the major family commitments. It also tends to be the most available time slot when compared with other school-related programming.

**There is not a horse club or sport to gain any credits. Is there a way to get extracurricular credit for this activity?**

Students could apply for credit through the “Credit Flexibility” procedure. There is an application that needs to be completed and submitted, prior to the deadlines and a committee review (including student and parent) before hours and standards-based tasks can accrue towards credit. **What classes can students take during the summer?**

Findlay City Schools provides an opportunity for “summer school” to both recover credits lost and gain original credit for others. The offering of courses is made annually, but typically Physical Education is offered for original credit.

**Is there a specific counselor who spearheads CCP?**

All counselors are the point person for students on their caseload as it relates to CCP. Mr. Mehok (L – R) is the school liaison for CCP as it relates to our partners with Higher Education.

**Is there a limit on the number of times the ACT/SAT can be taken?**

To the best of our knowledge, both tests can be taken multiple times. At some point, however, the scores will likely remain fairly constant. Many of our students take the ACT two times, others take it more. **Are all scores reported or only the highest?** Each test yields separate results from other testing dates and are indicated as such on score reports. On testing day, students identify the colleges they want to receive the results of their tests. Students do not have to select any colleges, in which case they will need to pay to have them sent at a later date. Findlay High School receives the results of all college tests students take and scores are reported on their high school transcript. Again, results are reported per each testing date. Some colleges will choose to use the best scores across multiple test (super-score), while others will not.

**How long after the end of a semester are the transcripts available on Parchment?**

Transcripts are available on Parchment when all necessary data is collected (grades received by teachers, verified, etc) and this is typically 2-3 weeks after the semester ends.

**When should my student take the SAT for the first time?**

Students should take the SAT during their Junior or Senior year. The PSAT is typically taken during the 11<sup>th</sup> grade year and while it provides data for the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test it also serves as a great practice for the SAT.
